

# Controlled 1080 baiting program



## OCTOBER BAITING PROGRAM

The next round of the controlled 1080 baiting program is due to take place on **14 and 15 October, 2020.**

Council is offering eligible landholders access to manufactured 1080 baits for the effective control of wild dogs, foxes and pigs.

### YOUR OBLIGATIONS

Landholders are reminded of their obligation to notify all adjoining and directly opposite landholders of their baiting activity 72 hours prior to laying baits and to ensure the provided warning signage is attached to all property entrances and extremities throughout the baiting period. Can't make it to distribution? You can elect a third party to collect baits on your behalf with written authorisation. If you have provided Council with written authority previously, that authority is still in effect until you elect someone else or cancel it.

# Wild Dog, Fox & Pig - Controlled 1080 Baiting Program

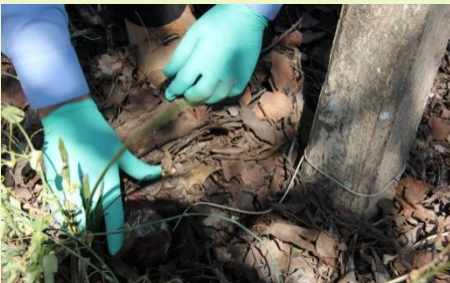
## LAYING BAITS



Baits will be supplied in a tied poisons bag. These should be moved and stored in a sealed bucket out of reach of children and pets.



Wearing gloves, tie string around the bait and secure to tree bases, fallen logs or fence posts (internal fences).



Bury the bait just below the surface to avoid collection from birds and non-target species. Dogs and pigs will dig the bait up.



Cover the bait over with leaf litter. Make a record of where baits have been placed.

## WORKING TOGETHER



**Working together with neighbouring properties in a baiting program is the most effective way to have an impact on pest animals.**

Whether you've got a productive herd, you're a producer who has destocked or you enjoy a non-primary production lifestyle in the bush, working together to tackle the pest animal issues will have the greatest impact on their populations.

Wild dogs and pigs don't recognise boundaries, so your slice of bush, whether involved in primary production or not, could be harboring pests that cause destruction to the environment, wildlife and primary production.

### MANUFACTURED BAIT EFFICACY

Information on the methods of improving the lure capabilities of the baits will be provided during the distribution.

In the meantime, pre-feeding pig populations with fermented grain or molasses prior to laying baits is recommended, while 'sweetening' the supplied wild dog/fox baits with pan fats and blood will increase the 'nose' of the bait.
