

Herbicide Subsidy Program

The program provides assistance to landholders to identify, treat and prevent restricted invasive plants on land under their control.

The *Biosecurity Act 2014* states landholders have a General Biosecurity Obligation (GBO) to manage restricted and prohibited plants (pest weeds).

Invasive weed infestation and spread cause environmental and economic impacts to the region, by loss in productive horticultural and pastoral land. They can also cause toxicity and even death in livestock.

How to Access the Herbicide Subsidy Program

To access herbicide at a 50 per cent subsidised rate, contact Council's Pest Management Team and an officer will complete a Property Pest Management Plan on site with you.

Once you have treated the pest weeds with the appropriate herbicide and there are signs the treatment has been successful, contact the Pest Management Officer to finalise the processing of your herbicide subsidy. You will need to provide a copy of your receipt for purchase of the herbicide.

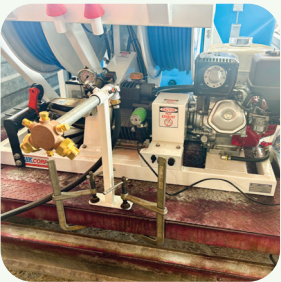


Spray Equipment Loan

Council has spray equipment available for loan by landholders to assist in the treatment of pest weeds on their property, including:

- 600L trailer mount quik-spray
- 600L trailer mount quik-spray with boomless jets
- 200L skid frame spray

An application and small bond is required.
