- Prior to this the building was a butcher's shop and evidence of this remains internally, (a concrete floor section.)
- Before the butcher's the building was a general store and petrol supplier. The petrol pump has been removed and stored.

- Gable ended pitched roof building with fibro parapet and skillion street awning.
- Chamfer board cladding to dado and fibro with cover strips over to side elevations.
- Front elevation mostly timber framed glass shop-front windows with a recessed, angled central entry.
- Internally the ceiling lining (tongue and groove boards) follows the pitch of the roof up to the collar tie.
- Stop chamfered timber posts and corner brackets to street awning.
- Prominent corner position on William Street.



- The site was extended and a new school building was erected in 1916-17.

<u>School</u>

- Typical school building, gable ended with a pitched roof and slatted gable infill.
- Bank of timber framed windows under a large skillion awning on each gable end.
- Verandahs on each side have been enclosed with weatherboards.
- Ornate roof ventilator is no longer evident.
- Internally the ceilings are ornate pressed metal and in excellent condition.
- This main core is currently being used as the school office.
- Rear half hipped extension houses classrooms, c1950s.

Residence

- C1905, Short ridge pyramid roof bungalow with incorporated front verandah and rear half hip.
- · Weatherboard clad with sash windows (no Hoods evident)
- Two-rail slatted balustrade with paired posts beside central entry stair.
- High-set on timber stumps and ant caps with batten infill.

Significance:

Significant as an example of an early country town school.

History:

The Queensland Farmers Co-operative Association opened a butter factory at Grantham in June 1907.

A foundation plaque on the current brick building shows a date of 1926 and lists the Directors of the Co-op at the time.

Description:

- Large double height saw-tooth roofed building.
- Constructed with expressed brick piers and brick infill.
- Right hand side skillion addition, currently used as a residence.
- Row of timber framed windows in the clerestory of each bay.
- Front elevation shows boarded over window openings with expressed lintels and large industrial roller door openings.
- Boiler and tall concrete chimney at rear.
- Some relationship to the William Street Avenue of trees as the building terminates the view along the street from the township.

Significance:

Important for its association with the dairy industry, one of the Shire's most important early industries.

It is a substantial building which demonstrates the typical form and materials of a dairy factory.



Toowoomba Station is a building of State level of Significance. This footbridge would be of state significance at that site.







History: A halt was provided on the railway at Grantham in 1875. Over the next few years, a station master's house, shelter shed, goods shed and sheep yards were built. A station building was erected by R. Wilson & Co in 1899 and when the line was duplicated, an island platform and a new station were provided in 1912.

At its height, the station contained the station buildings, signal cabin, toilets, footbridge, goods shed, cream shed, 1 ton crane, 20 ton weighbridge, station master's house, gangers' residence, trucking yards.

From the late 1960s, the buildings have been gradually removed and the residences sold until little now remains except the signal cabin.

The Station building has been relocated to the Gatton & District Historical Society village.

Small gable-roofed lowset building, six-pane windows. It originally held a 12-lever T-bar Mackenzie and Holland frame

Significance:

Recorded for its association with the evolution of the railway system.



Church and Presbytery

Tenders were called for the church in January 1914. The foundation stone, which includes a plaque in Latin, was laid by Archbishop Duhig on 8 March. At this time, the church was said to have been the largest between Ipswich and Toowoomba. The architect was R. Coutts and the builder was R. Worley, both of Ipswich. The church was the first building of a planned new complex on a new 28 acre site described as "on an eminence about a quarter mile from the town."

The prompt start of construction was fortunate because the old church was demolished by a fierce storm only a short time later, on 3 April.

The new church was completed and opened officially at the end of September 1914.

The date of the Presbytery is not certain.

Hall

The hall is the former St Joseph's school, associated with St Joseph's Convent (see separate listing).

A Catholic school was established in Helidon c1871 and was registered as a non-vested school. In 1874, the school was taken over by the Sisters of Joseph who also established a convent. The sisters withdrew from Queensland in 1875 and the school temporarily closed. In January 1880, the Sisters of Mercy agreed to take over the school. The buildings at this time were on the eastern bank of Lockyer Creek.

On 1 August 1915, a new school was built on the large site where St Joseph's Church had been opened the previous year. The architects were GHM Addison & Son of Brisbane.

The convent closed in 1963 and the buildings were taken over by the Christian Brothers. The school was moved to its current position and is now used as a hall.

Description:

The church, the hall (former School), bell tower and presbytery are in a line along the edge of a sharp fall to creek flats where there are the remains of an old sports ground. (Goal posts, Basketball Hoops)

Church:

- Gable ended pitched corrugated roof
- Gabled flat pan and roll roofed, central front entry porch.
- Two roof top vents and a larger pyramid roofed lantern that protrudes to the interior, possibly for light or ventilation.
- Rear semi-octagonal sanctuary with the vestries on each side.

- Feature coloured glass circular windows arranged symmetrically, two on the front and two on the rear elevation.
- Constructed of brick and buttressed with rendered masonry along the side elevations.
- Semi-circular arched windows with label moulds are centred between the buttresses along the side elevations.
- Smaller semi-circular coloured glass arched windows feature in the Sanctuary.
- Internally a semi-circular arch separates the Nave from the Sanctuary.
- Ceiling supported by hammer beam trusses and is partly lined with tongue and groove boards.

Bell Tower

• Large bell in steel-framed tower surmounted by a small gable roof and Latin cross.

Hall

- Previously the school building moved from elsewhere on site
- Gable ended pitched corrugated roof. Decorative timber infill to each gable end.
- Bank of six casement windows with timber and metal window hoods at each gable end.
- Three simply designed vents are spaced evenly across the ridge of the roof.
- Verandahs to both sides. The front verandah has a pedimented entry and valanced bay but is enclosed with weatherboards and casement windows otherwise. The rear verandah is open with a two rail dowel balustrade, valance and corner brackets.

Presbytery

- C1900 asymmetrical bungalow with L-shaped incorporated verandah and enclosed sleep out along the right hand side.
- The gable front features a tripartite sash window with coloured glass and curved window hood.
- A side gable features a double sash window and curved hood.
- The residence is clad with weatherboard.
- Single skin with exposed studs and vertical T&G boards.
- Simple two rail slatted balustrade thought to be a refurbishment.
- French doors with fanlights open to the verandah.
